"Kayak Care & Repair"

Monday, May 16th, 7 pm Jewish Community Center Providence RI

All boats will require maintenance and repair from time to time. Most often these repairs can be done on the water and then finished at home. Come learn basic small boat care and repair with Carl Ladd, owner of Osprey Sea Kayak Adventures Inc. During this presentation he will discuss how to properly maintain and care for your small boat and provide a few ideas for field repair kits. He will also touch on a few basic repair techniques for both composite and plastic boats that could save you both money and time. Following the presentation there will be time for specific questions and sharing of ideas on the topic of boat repair.

Basic Whitewater Course

The RICKA Whitewater Group will be holding a Class II Whitewater Kayak Course on June 18-19, 2011. The course will be taught by ACA certified whitewater instructor Mike Rock and will be free for qualified RICKA and ACA members. If you are not an ACA member, there will be a one-time \$5 event membership fee.

In this course, participants will learn and refine the techniques needed to paddle in class II whitewater. After a review of the basic strokes on flatwater, we will head to the river to work on eddy turns, peel-outs and ferries. We will also cover river reading and basic river safety. The class will be held on the Deerfield River in western Massachusetts.

While this is a beginner whitewater course, it is not for novice paddlers.

You must be able to handle self-rescues (wet exits) and already know the basic strokes. Previous moving water experience is a plus. Participants must provide their own equipment including a whitewater kayak, sprayskirt and helmet. Recreational kayaks are not allowed in this class.

The session will be followed by a 4-mile paddle on the Blackstone River from River Island Park (directly behind the Museum) to Manville. The first mile is rocky and contains a few sets of rapids. This trip is suitable for shorter boats (14 feet and under) and for paddlers with good boat control.

Trip Report - the "Mighty Quinn"

As I went to bed on Saturday night, heavy rains were falling and the wind outside was howling. It sounded like a train was passing by my window. By the time the storm had passed, three inches of rain had fallen across much of southern New England. I fell asleep thinking that there would be lots of paddling options for the next few days.

I woke up Sunday morning to bright blue skies and a flooded basement. I also found an email from Paul looking to paddle the Quinapoxet River. The "Quinny" or "Mighty Quinn" was on my list of rivers to paddle, so I agreed immediately.

The Quinapoxet begins in the foothills north of Worcester and empties into the Wachusett Reservoir. It is a narrow creek-like river that rises and falls quickly after heavy rains. We would paddle a popular whitewater section from River Street in Holden to the Wachusett Reservoir in West Boylston - about 3 miles. The Mass Central Rail Trail follows the river for much of the run.

The river starts off with quickwater and some easy class II rapids. Paul got caught off guard entering the first rapid and quickly took a swim. Little did we know that this would be an omen of things to come.

With Paul safely back in his boat, we worked our way downstream enjoying the ever increasing waves and catching eddies when we could find them. As we approached the old Springdale Mill we pulled over to scout the first class

III rapid.

The Springdale Rapid is short, but by far the most difficult rapid on the trip. The river runs fast through the remnants of an old mill complex creating tricky holes at the top, and large waves at the bottom. There is a large eddy on river left, but it can be difficult to catch in the fast moving water.

I positioned myself downstream with a throw bag as Paul lined up for the run. His plan was to go straight down the middle, and then left. He cleared the first waves easily, but over compensated and got spun sideways going into the next. Out of the boat he came. I threw him a rope, but misjudged the current and he couldn't reach it.

It was a long, fast swim, but Paul was able to get to shore without too much difficulty. Unfortunately in the fast moving water, his boat continued downstream all the way the to reservoir before he was able to swim out and retrieve it.

After my botched throw, I started downstream to help, but soon learned from a couple walking up the Rail Trail that Paul was out of the river and off to find his boat. I headed back to my boat and decided to portage the Springdale Rapid. I also scouted a 3-foot drop just downstream, and decided to portage that as well. I was able to run the rest of the river without incident.

When I got back to the car I found Paul's boat on the roof, but no sign of Paul. He had headed back upstream on the Rail Trail looking for me. He got back about a half hour later. Our original plan was to do two runs, but we both agreed that it probably wouldn't be a good idea to push our luck.

F ditor's Note

After editing the newsletter and chairing the Safety & Education Committee for the past 15 months, I've decided to concentrate on the latter. So this will be my last newsletter; the baton is passing to Erik Eckilson, whom I know will do an outstanding job.
