

# A Short History of RICKA Remembering 40 Years of Paddling Fun

What is now the Rhode Island Canoe & Kayak Association (RICKA) was originally founded as the Rhode Island Canoe Association (RICA). The group was born on a Monday night in April 1977. Its father was Manny Point, and its mother was a tiny listing in the "What's Going On" section of the Providence Journal. Thirty people showed up for the initial meeting, and RICKA was off and running, or should we say paddling.



Many people had a hand in the creation of RICKA including Manny Point, Leo Fontaine, Barbara Strawn (August), John Baxter, Carolyn Stefanik (Cyr), Pete Pandozzi, Dick Ormsby, Henry and Nikki Dziadosz, and more. **This year, we celebrate RICKA's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary!** 

From the start, RICKA was founded with a focus on safety. In the late 1970's, boating accidents were becoming more frequent, and PFD use was not common. On RICKA trips, everyone was required to wear a PFD. This focus on safety was due in large part to Manny Point, and it gave the club a legitimate foundation and a focus that continues to this day.

# **The Bombproof Roll and Beyond** – by Paul Dutky

The ability to hold the kayak level or on edge using knee pressure, to maintain balance using body lean, or to shift weight forward or



backward are skills that are fundamental to even simple maneuvers such as bracing, upstream ferries, and the Eskimo roll. The Bombproof Roll and Beyond is an introduction to edge control and balance for paddlers from the beginner to expert. Author Paul Dutky shares his experience to help paddlers master techniques that will enable them to surf and to run challenging water with confidence.

The thrill of kayaking can quickly turn to panic if you don't know how to right a capsized kayak.



The Eskimo Roll is the key to building confidence for all paddling conditions. Shortly after it was founded, RICKA began publishing its <u>Paddler</u> newsletter to keep members up-to-date on club news and trip information. Newsletter Editors John Baxter, Alan August, Caryl Salisbury, Cat Radcliffe and Erik Eckilson have continued to produce the Paddler newsletter each month for the last 40 years.

Recognizing that information was needed more frequently than a monthly newsletter could provide, the club also established a telephone hotline that members could call on Thursday evenings to learn about options for that weekend's trips. The telephone hotline continued into the 1990's when it was eventually replaced by the RICKA website.

Charlie Allsworth launched the first RICKA webpage in 1993. Alan August became the RICKA webmaster in 1995 and expanded the site significantly. Initially the website was an extension of the Paddler newsletter, but by 1997 it had evolved into a destination itself with links to trip calendars, message boards and email lists.

For many, regular visits to the RICKA website keep us up to date on what is going on with the club, and help us plan our paddling adventures. Today, Cheryl Thompson is the webmaster for <u>RICKA.org</u>, <u>Flatwater</u>, <u>Whitewater</u> and



<u>Wilderness</u>; Eric Johnson is the <u>Sea Kayak</u> webmaster; and Susan Engelman manages our Facebook page.

The original RICA logo paid homage to our open boating roots – a solo canoeist over an outline of the State of Rhode Island. In 1992, Frank Oleksyk was one of several RICA members who submitted designs for a new logo. His design included a canoe paddle with blue waves and the words "RICA" at the top and "Rhode Island Canoe Association" at the bottom. It was adopted at the November 1992 meeting. In 1998, the club acknowledged the growing influence of kayaks by adopting its current name – the Rhode Island Canoe & Kayak Association - and changing the logo accordingly.

In the early years of the club many people were interested in racing, so the club developed a large and active racing group. RICKA ran the Rhode Island Whitewater Championship on the Branch River for over 25 years. Mike Bussell was the longtime chair of the Branch River Race, which brought whitewater racers to Rhode Island from across the northeast on the third weekend in March each year. RICKA also ran the Rhode Island Fall Classic flatwater race on the Wood/Pawcatuck River until 2007. This race was generally held in September, and Barbara and Alan August were it's long-time chairs.

In the early years of RICKA many people also wanted to paddle whitewater, so

through trial and error (lot's of error) and a few destroyed canoes, the club established a large and active whitewater group. Safety remained a major focus for Whitewater paddlers, and experienced paddlers were encouraged to become ACA certified instructors and teach newer members. Safety clinics, run by long-time Safety and Education Chair Kevin Allsworth, were also popular events for Whitewater paddlers. Now chaired by Andy Viera, the <u>Whitewater</u> group continues to paddle whitewater rivers and streams across the northeast.

Then as now, many of RICKA's early members simply wanted to enjoy the pleasure of a quiet trip on a meandering river, and they were accommodated as well. In the early days, Manny Point led many of the flatwater trips, and he always placed an emphasis on safety. Today, the <u>Flatwater</u> goup is chaired by Cheryl Thompson, and it has grown to become the largest of RICKA's four interest groups with trips on lakes and rivers in Rhode Island and across New England.



In 1989, RICKA added the <u>Sea Kayak</u> or Coastal Cruising group in response to growing interest in this area. Now chaired by Carleen McOsker, the Sea Kayak group is specifically focused on kayaking in coastal environments, and organizes trips throughout the spring, summer, and fall.

Camping has always been an important part of the RICKA, but it wasn't until 2013 that RICKA established its Wilderness

group. Jim Cole, Chuck Horbert, Mike Bussell and Bill Luther were instrumental in creating our Wilderness group, which organizes trips that involve paddling, camping and other wilderness skills. Chuck Horbert is the current <u>Wilderness</u> Chair, and Henry Dziadosz and Louise Price have also organized RICKA camping trips for many years.



Today, the Rhode Island Canoe & Kayak Association is the largest paddle sport club in Rhode Island, and one of the largest in New England. Of course, paddling is at the heart of everything that we do. Each year, RICKA organizes hundreds of trips ranging from easy daytrips to weeklong excursions. There is trip for every interest and skill level at RICKA. Our affiliated clubs – the <u>Blackstone Valley Paddle Club</u> and <u>Southern New England Paddlers</u> – also run evening trips throughout the summer.

From its inception, training has also been an important part of the RICKA mission. Each year RICKA offers fun and informative training sessions that might include flatwater, whitewater, wilderness or sea kayak skill and safety training. Many of these sessions are offered free of charge or at a significant discount to our members.

In addition to trips and training, eleven monthly issues of our newsletter the <u>Paddler</u> are produced each year, and eight <u>monthly meetings</u> with interesting and informative speakers are organized. Our <u>library</u> continues to be updated with new paddling books and DVD's, and our <u>websites</u>, email lists and <u>Facebook page</u> continue to provide updated information to our members.

None of this would be possible without the generous efforts of our many volunteers. These volunteers coordinate trips, plan and execute training sessions, and work behind the scenes to make everything happen. Thanks to all of the volunteers that make this club possible.

If you have yet to put some time in supporting club activities please consider doing so in this 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year. Maybe you could coordinate a trip at your favorite paddling site, or perhaps you have a special paddling skill that could be added to a training session or spoken about at a monthly meeting. Please volunteer to help.

Most importantly, don't forget to renew your RICKA membership. Your 2016 membership will expire on March 31, 2017. You can register or renew for the 2017 year at:



Do you remember the RICKA Lamp? The lamp began its life in 1985 as a Chianti bottle with a light bulb stuck in its neck. It was brought to the auction at the RICKA Holiday Party, and became one of RICKA's most enduring traditions.

Each year since 1985 the lamp has been resold at the RICKA auction. The winning bidder takes custody of the lamp for one year, but must return it the following year with the addition of a new RICKA decoration. The longevity of this tradition was assured in 1989 when a solid wood base was added to the lamp.

In recent years, the RICKA auction has been part of the RICKA Family Picnic. Safety and Education Chair Cat Radcliffe has auctioned off the lamp, and for the past several years RICKA President Susan Engelman has been the highest bidder. At this year's auction, it was decided that Susan should become the lamp's permanent custodian.

Susan is a long-time RICKA member, flatwater paddler and trip leader. She will be stepping down this year as one of RICKA's longest serving Presidents. She will be moving to FL, but we know that the RICKA Lamp will always have a special place in her home, and heart.
