Pawtuxet River Cleanup

On September 14th a dozen members from RICKA volunteered to clean up the 7-mile section of the Pawtuxet River from Knight Street in Warwick to Rhodes on the Pawtuxet in Cranston, just before the river empties into Narragansett Bay.

The Pawtuxet River is formed by the confluence of North and South branches of the Pawtuxet, which merge in West Warwick. From there it then runs approximately 12 miles until it empties into Narragansett Bay at the Pawtuxet Cove. The last three miles of the river form the boundary between Cranston and Warwick. The section of river that we would be cleaning is getting paddled more frequently thanks to improved access provided by the Pawtuxet River Authority and Watershed Council (PRAWC).

The on-water cleanup team consisted of 9 boats (5 canoes and 4 kayaks). The PRAWC assisted by providing reaching tools, a dumpster and a flat bottom boat that would launch from the take-out at Rhodes on the Pawtuxet that we could use off-load trash from our smaller boats.

As we headed downstream, the river follows Route I-95 for much of it course. In spite of the traffic noise, this is a pretty section of river. The banks are lined with





trees, and wildlife is abundant.

Unfortunately, the flat bottom boat provided by the PRAWC was unable to navigate upstream to Knight Street. After 2-1/2 miles and 2 hours of clean-up with no means to off-load our haul, our boats were overwhelmed and we reluctantly had to bypass trash for the last 4-miles of the trip.

Adding to our challenge, it rained during the second half of the trip. Still, each of the dozen volunteers collected the equivalent of a garbage bag filled with smaller debris that included hundreds of glass and plastic bottles, beer cans, styrofoam cups, grocery bags, other small items.

In addition to the dozen garbage bags of small debris, we collected larger items that included:

- a dozen plastic landscaping containers
- 3 large plastic tubs
- a large styrofoam tub
- part of a kiddie pool
- multiple large slabs of Styrofoam
- a large plastic baby push buggy

Over 250 lbs. of liter was collected that, thanks to the efforts of these RICKA volunteers and the assistance of the PRAWC, will not find its way into Narragansett Bay.

Thanks to Gary Powers for organizing this cleanup, and all the RICKA volunteers that helped.
